Foundational Truth: All that I have comes from the hand of God James 1:16-18

Lie #1 I don't have enough to be generous.

 \rightarrow *Truth: Generosity is not defined by how much you give, but by how much you have left over.* Mark 12:41-44

Lie #2 God intended all His blessings to be for me.

→ *Truth:* God's wants you to not only enjoy your blessings but also to share them. 1 Timothy 6:17-19; Genesis 12:1-3

Lie #3 I am fearful that I won't have enough if I am generous.

→ **Truth:** God will supply all your NEEDS in Christ Jesus Philippians 4:10-20; Hebrews 13:5-6

<u>Course Correction for 2021</u> Digging Deeper into the Lies about Generosity

Ice Breaker: Jesus is quoted as saying "*It is more blessed to give than to receive*" (Acts 20:35). Do you think this is the perspective of most Christians today? Is it your perspective?

1. Let's be reminded of the foundational truth regarding everything we have. Look up *James 1:16-18* before we start discussing the lies we might believe about generosity.

2. Discuss each lie and the truth remedy along with the Scriptural support for each.

Lie #1. I don't have enough to be generous.

Truth: Generosity is not defined by how much you give, but by how much you have left over. Read Mark 12:41-44

 \rightarrow Do you think that most of us are giving our of our abundance?

Lie #2. God intended all His blessings to be for me.

Truth: God's wants you to not only enjoy your blessings but also to share
them.Read 1 Timothy 6:6-10 & 17-19

→ Discuss the principle Tony suggested: *Share* equal or more than you *enjoy*. Does this sound burdensome or joyful?

Lie #3. I am fearful that I won't have enough if I am generous.

→ Truth: God will supply all your NEEDS in Christ Jesus Read Philippians 4:10-20; Hebrews 13:5-6

- → What does sacrificial giving look like today in a world that has categorized *everything as a need*?
- → What are the ramifications for generosity when informed by the truths of Hebrews 13:5-6?
