# <u>The Glorious Gospel of Jesus Christ</u> A Survey of the Book of Romans God's Sovereign Love Guarantees Our Salvation *Digging Deeper into Romans 8:28-30*

1. Let's remember that the context of Romans 5-8 is *hope* and God's *love*. Reread 5:3-5; 8:23-25, and 37-39 to establish this theme.

2. Read Romans 8:28-30. Paul uses 5 words to describe God's actions in bringing us to salvation. God is the sole actor in this passage and we are the recipients. Talk through the concepts that each word communicates and read the associated passages.

# $\rightarrow$ He Foreknew and Predestined You

The concepts of foreknowledge and predestination go together: Eph 1:3-6; Acts 2:22-23; 4:27-28 These passages support the position that for God to know you is more than simply having information, it refers to a relationship of a loving choice. Gen. 18:19; Jer. 1:5; Hos. 13:5; Amos 3:2

<u>*Reminder*</u>: We will be discussing our responsibility to believe in chapter 10, but today is God's side of the coin.

#### $\rightarrow$ He Justified You

Justified means "declared righteous and we have discussed this many times in Romans
