- 1. Let's start our discussion with reading Romans 11:33-36. What is the appropriate response from us to God's transcendent sovereignty?
- 2. Tony suggested that a definition of God's righteousness/justice is:

God always acts in accordance with what is right and <u>He, Himself, is the final standard of what is right</u>.

If this is true, then God is incapable of doing something unjust. Survey through the following passages and discuss how they inform this truth (Gen. 18:25; Deut. 32:4; Is. 45:19).

- 3. Now Read Romans 9:1-14 and discuss God's sovereign plan for Israel as illustrated through Isaac and Jacob.
 - Specifically discuss the concept of "unconditional election" as presented in verse 11
 - What do we do with the phrase ". . . Esau I hated?" Doesn't this seem harsh of God?
